CPRA using giant models to test Mid-Barataria diversion

The Coastal Protection \& Restoration Authority's proposed $\$ 1.3$ billion Mid-Barataria Sediment Diversion in Plaquemines Parish has proven endlessly controversial, so the CPRA commissioned two gigantic models of the structure in Massachusetts to make sure the diversion will work the way they think it will.
Brad Barth, CPRA's operations assist administrator for the Mid-Barataria and Mid-Breton Sediment Diversions, was in Holden, Mass., earlier this month visiting a 200 -foot-long model of the Mississippi River, complete with the entrance CPRA - page 2

to the diversion conveyance channel, and a $100-$-foot-long model of the exit from the conveyance channel, complete with outfall into Barataria basin. The $1: 65$ scale models were constructed by Alden Labs, the same company that built the 10,000-square-foot model of the lower Mississippi River for LSU's Center for River Studies in Baton Rouge. And Barth said CPRA plans to tap Alden again after testing is completed for the Barataria diversion to build models for the Breton diversion.

The river diversions are controversial for a number of reasons in Plaquemines Parish. First, because fishermen believe the influx of fresh water will kill oysters and drive shrimp, crabs and fin fish out of the bays. Second, they tout studies claiming the diversions will accomplish the exact opposite of their intended effect and wash away marshland rather than building it. And
third, opponents tout still more studies claiming that the modern Mississippi River lacks the necessary amount of sediment to build the land that the CPRA claims the diversions will produce.

It's that third controversy that is behind these particular models. Dr. Dan Gessler, Alden's vice president, said takingly constructed painsthe dimensions of the river the diversion channel and Baradiversion channel and Barataria Bay. But they ve also been tiny with a scale amount of tiny plastic pieces precisely engineered to float, sink and stick exactly like sediment does as it's carried along the river.
"The sediment cannot be sand because it won't move in the scale model, so we switched to lightweight plastic material," said Gessler. "We can derive an equation for the density of the particles to match the prototype.
If you poured a handful of those plastic bits into a glass of water, Gessler said they would behave just like a handful of

The two models cut out much of the diversion's conveyance channel because that section is a predictable, continuous model in a single building. The river model has piles of the plastic bits stacked up to eight inches deep at points to mimic the exact contours of the river bottom. Gessler said testing is expected to wrap up early next year Barth said the model will indicate the most efficient way to usher sediment from the river to the bay and all the scenarios that accompany that process.

In a copy of the lawsuit sent to The Gazette by Black's attorney, Edwin M. Shorty Jr. of New Orleans, Shorty writes that Black was attempting to de-escalate tensions between the two football teams on the field after LWHS pulled off a late victory. The result was later forfeited due to LWHS dressing multiple ineligible players.

Black's suit claims he was confronted and verbally and physically assaulted by an unnamed BCHS football coach, BCHS Principal Jemi Carlone and several PPSO deputies. It claims a deputy "lunged at Mr. Black attempting to remove Mr. Black's department issued taser" as Black was attempting to disengage from the incident, then describes another deputy's use of the police baton. After Black was released following detention and questioning by PPSO investigators, the suit claims he sought treatment at an Ochsner emergency room for injuries sustained in the struggle.
Black's suit names as defendants Plaquemines Sheriff Jerry Turlich, Carlone, two identified PPSO officers, two unnamed deputies, an unnamed band director for BCHS who is also a PPSO reserve deputy, an unnamed football coach and an unnamed civilian. He is seeking $\$ 1$ million, plus attorney's fees, for physical and emotional pain and suffering, deprivation of rights, punitive damages and lost wages from deprivation of rights, punitiv.

For many of you your hunting season is over and for many of you it is in full swing. But, regardless of what stage of it that you're in I thought it might be a timely article to publish a short article on some recipes that my family likes. Hopefully you filled a tag. Happy eating!

Flanks \& Tri-Tips
You can marinate them for an hour or two (I don't always) then I sprinkle on heavily McCormick's coarse ground steak seasoning. On the flank steak after sprinkling on the seasoning I then chop up some onions and green peppers and lay on the flank. Then I roll it up and in it together w/ toothpicks. You can presoak the toothpicks in water so they don burn up as easily.
I smoke them on low heat for an hour on my Camp Chef pellet grill and then turn up the heat to about 300 . When done, pull off and slice paper thin across grain These make great hors d'oeuvres.

## Knife Sharpening 101

By Tom Claycombe

Since we're in the middle of hunting season I thought that this would be a timely topic. All Outdoorsmen use a knie and yetril bet not sean sharpen one. I know this is a true statement or why do shows have me conduct Knife Sharpening seminars from Texas to Vegas and on up to Alaska?

In the old days all that our dad used to sharpen knives was an Arkansas stone but nowadays, most knives are constructed of metal so
hard that you can't sharpen them on an Arkansas stone so I recommend using a diamond stone. With a diamond stone you'll be able to obtain an edge within literally two to three minutes. Even a hard knife like a Diamond Blade or Buck knife. I've had good luck with Smith's Consumer Products fine diamond stones. Smith has the best stones.

Let's get started. You see people grinding their knife in a circular motion, others cutting into the stone and yet others cutting away. Which way is the correct method? It doesn't matter, as long as you use the same angle all the
way down the edge and do way down the edge and do
the same number of strokes on each side. If you don't do the same number of strokes on each side then the edge will be lopsided.

Sohowmany times should you stroke the knife on each side? It doesn't matter but everyone does three times so just do that or you'll freak everyone out. You will tend to have a smaller angle as you get into the curvature of the blade. You may be starting out on the hilt at 25 -degrees but as you get into the curvature of the blade you're at 15 -degrees. You want to use
want to start right off on an Arkansas stone. Then to put a wicked edge on them you'll
need to progress to a smooth need to progress to a smooth
steel. I'll talk to Ronald about steel. I'll talk to Ronald about

ing. Use good quality knives. ing. Use good quality knives.

had good luck with Knives of had good luck with Knives of Alaska and Diamond Blades. They re well-made and con-
structed out of good materials. The metal is hard so they als. The metal is hard so they
will hold an edge but not so will hold an edge but not so
hard that they cannot be easily sharpened.

## Pro Tips

Don't let your knife get super dull and it will be easier to put an edge back on it - To clean your diamond stone, use warm soapy water and a rag.
